How many footprints did each get? = 59 (A) · There were 519 footprints in all. 3 footprints were set aside. The rest were shared equally among 6 Scotland Yard. How many footprints did each get? = 86 (U) · Detective Sterling filled 5 boxes with 4 clues each, then found 60 more clues. How many clues are there in all? = 80 (E) · Detective Sterling collected 22 magnifying glasses in the morning and 65 magnifying glasses in the afternoon, then split them equally among 3 Scotland Yard.
